Clinton School is a proud place of approximately 475 students, 75 staff members, and a motivated parent population. I cannot thank her enough for all she has done to assist me through my two years, as well for her passion and dedication for supporting every student, colleague, and parent.

I am proud of our accomplishments at Clinton; none would have been possible without all of you. I thank you most sincerely for your continuous encouragement and collaboration. Clinton School will always be a special place to learn.

NEWS FROM PAC

The Parent Advisory Committee (PAC) provides a forum for interaction between the principal and parents. The goal is to develop action plans to address concerns of the Clinton community. Each month, the *Courier* will run a summary of the PAC meeting agenda and discussion. This summary is from the May meeting.

Discussion: Lunch/Recess Supervision

Action: There is still concern over the lunch and recess periods. Training has been provided for the lunch aides and there is ongoing communication among all Clinton School staff as to the day's events. Also, it is a great time to have staff and parents both take the opportunity to reiterate the values of our Character Education Program and to discuss with the students how to use those traits in real situations.
